Deafness	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Visual support</li> <li>• Graphics</li> <li>• Charts</li> <li>• Hands-on demonstrations</li> <li>• Repeating information</li> <li>• Tell the student who is speaking</li> </ul>
Emotional Disturbances	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Set goals aimed at social interactions</li> <li>• Schedules</li> <li>• Set personal goals</li> <li>• Clear rules</li> <li>• Quite area</li> </ul>
Intellectual Disability	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Break down content</li> <li>• Move while learning</li> <li>• Visuals</li> <li>• Immediate feedback</li> <li>• Extra time</li> <li>• Smaller groups</li> </ul>
Multiple Disabilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Help them to believe in themselves</li> <li>• Long term goals</li> <li>• Work in teams with other teachers</li> </ul>
Orthopedic Impairment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Slant board</li> <li>• Non-slip roll mats</li> <li>• Pencil grips</li> <li>• Special keyboards</li> <li>• Special writing paper</li> </ul>
Other Health Impaired	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Visuals</li> <li>• Scheduled breaks</li> <li>• Step-by-step instructions</li> <li>• Shorting of assignments</li> <li>• Adjusted lighting</li> </ul>

Specific Learning Disability	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Audio recording</li><li>• Break down work</li><li>• Larger text</li><li>• Designated teacher</li><li>• Notetaker</li><li>• Visuals</li></ul>
Speech or Language Impairment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Reduce classroom noise</li><li>• Verbal cues</li><li>• Quiet spot to work</li></ul>
Traumatic Brain Injury	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Student sits near teacher</li><li>• Low distractions</li><li>• Peer note taker</li><li>• Verbal and nonverbal cues</li><li>• Frequent breaks</li></ul>
Visual Impairment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Large print</li><li>• Peer note taker</li><li>• Tape recorder</li></ul>
